



# Young Adult Literature is WAY COOL!




The Raven Boys by Maggie Stiefvater



#### Bev Recommends...

The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind is a story of a young hero and is worth sharing with all generations. First released as a book for adults, this remarkable true story has now been made into a lovely picture book for children as well. William Kamkwamba's story begins in Malawi, a land where magic reigned and science was mysterious. Kamkwamba read and devoured all the knowledge he can find in the little library in his village. Ignoring the taunts of being misala -- crazy, -- he experiments with creating inventions from the scraps and pieces of junk. Eventually, he builds a windmill and brings to his village what very few Malawi's have -- electricity and running water. Both books give a real sense of the hard life in the village: one does so with words and the other with collage and paint illustrations. A dusty sand color used on the cover of the adult version and on the endpapers of the children's version perfectly matches the landscape as I remember sub-sahara Africa. This story takes me back to a place where I spent some time as part of a volunteer organization creating libraries. As you might imagine, that makes it pretty special for me but this story is inspiration for anyone!




In the Shadow of the Banyon by Vaddey Ratner



#### Deneen Recommends...

The Sandalwood Tree

The Sandalwood Tree brings to life two love stories, ninety years apart in war torn India. Martin and Evie Mitchell are American, living with their small son in an Indian village in the Himalayas in 1947, the infamous years of India's war of Partition. Martin, a historian is there on a Fulbright Fellowship to complete his Ph.D. thesis on Partition. But as a Jewish veteran of World War II, his demons have followed him to India, and he and Evie are growing further and further apart. As violence surrounds them. Evie finds herself



confined to their bungalow where she discovers behind a loose brick a packet of old letters which tell of a compelling story of love and war involving two young Englishwomen who lived in the same house in 1857. The Sandalwood Tree is a powerful story about betrayal, forgiveness, fate and love.

The Word of Mouth Book Club had a great discussion of the novel, and found the historical setting informative, the story engaging. Favorite quotes from the group:

"I think that when you create borders based on ideology you create a reason to fight. When you live side by side, you create a reason to get along." (Harry)

"Poverty is the worst form of violence." (Harry quoting Ghandi)





- \*\*\*Point to objects in the room that are similar to the ones in the book, so your child can **learn new vocabulary** words and associate things in the book with things in his or her world.
- \*\*\*Don't worry about reading the whole book if your child loses interest. Sometimes a story works if you read just the first sentence on each page. You can always skip to the last page and say "The end!"
