

Drummond students came by with a couple of teachers to talk books and dip into a few. Each student went home with a complimentary copy to get






# Mary McNear, Up At Butternut Lake



## **Graphic Novels**


Graphic novels are fictional stories presented in a comic strip format and bound like a book. They combine visual art with literary art to create richly engrossing stories. The term, "graphic novel" was first used in the 1960s among the comic book community but wasn't widely known until the 1980s with popular titles such as *The Dark Knight Returns* and *Watchmen*. The Japanese graphic novel, better known as manga, has a much longer history and has greatly influenced the American graphic novel. They are often the inspiration for epic Hollywood movies, but it wasn't until the beginning of this century that the graphic novel was added as a category in book stores. While typically intended for a more adult audience with complex plots and sophisticated subject matter, there are also great selections for young adults and kids. 



## No Place to Hide

by Glenn Greenwald
Are you curious or confused about the recent NSA
revelations? Glenn Greenwald's first-hand account
reads like a spy novel as it cuts through media
speculation and government disinformation.
Greenwald, a former litigator, constitutional
scholar, blogger, and columnist has long been an
outspoken critic of the post-9/11 surveillance state.
His uncompromising insistence on constitutional

principles made him the journalist of choice for

Edward Snowden's leak of top-secret NSA documents. From cryptic emails to Hong Kong hotel rooms, Greenwald details what it took for Snowden to make contact and share his trove of stolen documents without being caught. Greenwald also provides a succinct summary of the documents that have been publicly released so far, explaining why he chose those specific documents for release and what they reveal about secret state surveillance. He ends the book with a thoughtful discussion of the role of journalism in a democratic society, placing Snowden's leak in a wider context of whistleblowing and insisting on the the importance of adversarial journalism as a necessary check on government power. No Place to Hide is a page turner with insight into an important contemporary debate. Get your copy <a href="heterotechnology: here">here</a>.
