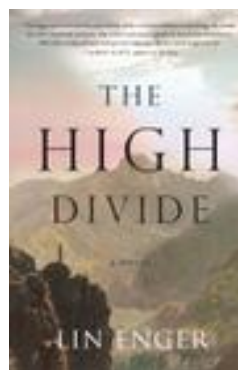
Kevin Horrocks Recommends...



Skink, No Surrender by Carl Hiaasen
He's at it again. The recurring literary character, Skink, makes another funny, timely and unique emergence righting some wrongs in Florida. The main characters in this book are a couple of believable and basically regular teens who get swept into very real dangers involving some of Hiaasen's unpredictable oddballs who operate outside of the law, and outside of normal thinking.

This is classic Hiaasen, but it's his first book written for teens, and my hope would be that it would capture their imaginations and direct them to the often outrageous, hysterically funny, and sometimes violent social commentary of many of his other stories.

The High Divide by Lin Enger.

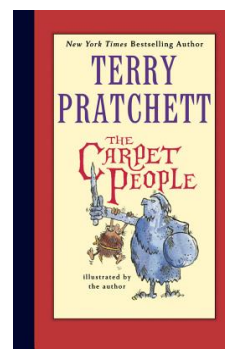
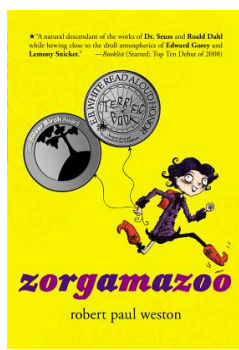
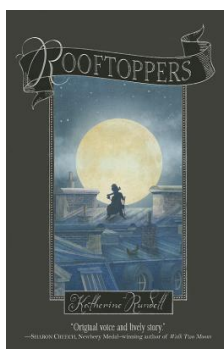
The plains landscape of the late 1800's, the emotional terrain of the Pope family, and a plot that blends the two make this a moving story. Gretta wakes one morning to find that her husband Ulysses is gone. Where has he gone and why? How well did she really know him? How long can she hold out with no support, two boys to raise, and a leering landlord at her door? Things change again when her two young teen boys run off in search of their dad, without her knowledge. A family in peril and a man's search for redemption all with a backdrop of the demise of the bison herds and the subjugation of the Plains Indian blend together to make this a gripping story of our human capacity for forgiveness.

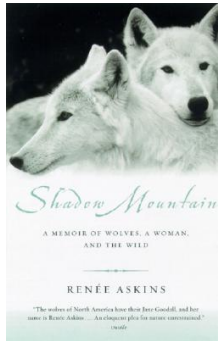

We had a great time partnering with the Cable Natural History Museum for our story time. Thanks to them, all of our little friends and their adults for attending.

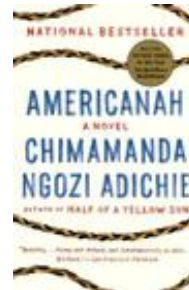
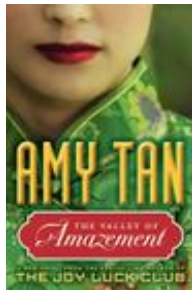
